Proxies: In accordance with MCRC LD3 Bylaws, Article VI, Section 2, "no person shall carry more than one (1) proxy. No reassignment of proxy rights shall be permitted." and Article VI, Section 1, "Proxy carriers shall be an elected PC from the same precinct as the proxy grantor, and otherwise meet criteria specified in the Maricopa County Republican Committee (MCRC) Bylaws." A proxy grantor must have specified the name of their proxy carrier on the proxy form prior to or in the presence of the notary or witnesses signing the proxy form.

LD Officer Candidate Nominations: All officer nominations will be from the floor. Candidates will have an opportunity to make a 2-minute nomination speech.

Paper Ballots: In accordance with MCRC Bylaws Article V, Section 6, paper ballots will be used for the election.

Swearing-In Ceremony: Following the officer election, the new officers will be sworn into office and conduct the balance of the meeting agenda.
